

Alleluia!

Toward rediscovering an Atmosphere of Praise

For the last two years since my wife and I moved to Green Bay, the name of this congregation has intrigued me. In our denomination there are many congregations named "Trinity" or "Zion" or "St John" or "Faith." There is no other "Alleluia" Lutheran Church in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

"Alleluia" is the Greek form of a word occasionally used in the Psalms. It encourages a very specific action. In Hebrew it means "Praise Yah." Yah is the nickname of Yahweh, the self-existent creator who chose the weak and foolish to carry his name among the nations. Like those whom he chooses today, they often struggled to recognize how much they depended on his steadfast love. They grumbled and complained about the way he treated them.

But he treated his only-begotten dearly loved son similarly. Though he prayed for a different outcome, that son Jesus followed the road to the cross where the Father abandoned him to suffering and death for a time, only to raise him up to life again as a promise of forgiveness and life.

From conversations I've had with some members, praise for Yahweh (referred to as "the Lord" in our pew Bibles) has not necessarily characterized the atmosphere and activities at Alleluia in recent years. Whatever the cause for any change in atmosphere, God uses the words of Holy Scripture to teach us the many reasons we have for praising him, starting with what he told Moses: [Yahweh, Yahweh], "the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin." (Exodus 34:6-7 NIV)

We say "Alleluia" for the steadfast, forgiving love he demonstrates in Jesus. We say "Alleluia" for the Scriptures and the Holy Spirit's work of creating and supporting our faith. We say "Alleluia" for a Father who gives what we need to support life in our bodies. We say "Alleluia" because when our time in our bodies is done, our lives with him will continue in the place he has prepared for us. Meanwhile, the way we strive to walk in the footsteps of our Heavenly Father can help others want to say "Alleluia" for God's love revealed by our actions.

"Praise the LORD [Alleluia], all you nations; extol him, all you peoples. For great is his love toward us, and the faithfulness of the LORD endures forever. Praise the LORD [Alleluia]." (Psalm 117:1-2 NIV)


Mechanical Room (located just inside the fellowship hall)




