From the Desk of

Pastor Mark Walters

"But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Revelation 2:4

Classical mythology is filled with a plethora of gods who control various sections of human existence. One of the most popular is the god of love. The Romans had their love goddess, Venus. The Greeks counterpart was Eros from which the English word, "erotic" derived. Eros was eventually pictured as a naked chubby boy holding a bow and arrow which held his power. According to the myth, anyone shot by Cupid's love arrow would be filled with uncontrollable sexual desire. Perhaps that's why Valentine's Day's most recognizable symbol is a Cupid drawing a bow and arrow, seeking to strike another unsuspecting person with a dose of uncontrollable romantic love.

Cupid is just a mythological figure but he's still flying around our culture shooting his arrows of mythological love. Culture defines love much like Cupid. Love is passion. Love is romance. Love is outward beauty (as defined by culture). Love is desire. Love is sex (whenever, however, with whomever). Love is a feeling, an emotion, a buzz, a bodily function, a girlfriend who owes you what you want, a boyfriend who's expected to lavish you with what you want.

Now you might think that I'm Ebenezer Scrooge of Valentine's Day. And while I'll admit I usually get Marleah's Valentine's card from the Dollar Store and, if we do out to eat, am content to share an entrée at a midpriced restaurant, I firmly believe that romantic love is a gift from God. In fact, God dedicated an entire book of his inspired Word, to celebrating the romantic love between a husband and wife. Some parts of the Song of songs might have been placed on the same library shelf as the old National Geographics. It's very graphic but it's very good because God smiles at the romantic love expressed between a husband and wife.

But Eros love, Cupid love, is still a feeling love. And feelings dissipate over time. What do we do when Cupid's arrow doesn't fill us with love feelings? The apostle Paul tells us to look away from Cupid and instead gaze upon the cross. "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Jesus should have been the One shooting arrows. Arrows of judgment. Arrows of wrath. Arrows of punishment. Arrows of hell... for eternity. There's absolutely nothing in us or from us that should have caused Jesus to love us. Yet he did. And he didn't love us from afar. He loved us in the most incredible way possible. He willingly left his throne room of heaven's glory, the place where all the angelic beings expressed their love for him. He willingly walked on our planet where the very people that he created more often than not rejected him. He willingly went to the cross where he took every one of God's righteous arrows against our sin and paid the price in full. And notice when Jesus did all this. Not when we were all decked out for him with a bouquet of flowers on Valentine's Day. But instead, while we considered him enemy #1, while our sinful nature rejected his lordship over us, when everything about us should have caused Jesus to discard us to hell, that's when Jesus not only said, but SHOWED his love for us by dying for us.

Let me ask you a question: Do you know where your Valentine's Day card is from last year? Did you even get one? Doesn't matter. We have something better than Cupid, something better than a schmaltzy, overpriced and overhyped, "holiday." We have Jesus. We have love that is truly love. And we have it today, tomorrow, and forever.

Changing Online Giving Donations

Access our Alleluia website: https://alleluiawrightstown.org and click the Online Giving button

- 1. Click Log In (upper right corner)
- 2. Enter your **Email Address**, then enter your **Password** (Click the <u>Forgot Password</u> link if needed, and a link to reset your password will be sent to your email address)
- 3. Click the **Profile** link (upper right corner)
- 4. Click the Transactions link in the left column.
- 5. Under the **Scheduled** tab, your current scheduled recurring donation(s)s should be listed. To change the amount of your donation or change funds, you have to click the **Cancel** link and cancel your current transactions.
- 6. Click Home (upper right corner)
- 7. There are 4 contribution Funds to choose from. Click the **Contribute** button for the fund you choose.

- 8. Enter the **\$Amount, Frequency** and **Start Date** for each of your donations. Click the **Add to Basket** button. Click the **Continue to Payment** button in your basket to proceed.
- 9. You can add or edit your payment method (credit, debit or bank account). There is an option to contribute an extra 2.75% to cover the processing fees. Click the **Continue to Review** button.
- 10. Review the transaction details and click the **Submit** button to complete.

Progress toward the opening of Alleluia Blessings Child Care Center continues to move forward!

The big "youth" room is all painted and it looks amazing! We received a donation of a beautiful large pantry and desk which is in the room. Security is in and the policies have been "approved" by pre-licensing and the pre-licensing visit is scheduled for February 10th at 10:00am. Everything has to be in place by then as if we were opening that day so we have been working diligently to get the rooms and all of the paperwork ready for review. It is a 3-4 hour site visit—if there are no major issues—we have heard the state licensing should then take about 2 weeks. The childcare software program Procare is up and running and we will open for pre-registration enrollments very soon! Some more wonderful news is that we were able to go through a closed daycare in Brillion and make an offer on some of the items we still needed which was accepted. We have a few volunteers on board to help with the pick up in Brillion and then the drop off at Alleluia on Tuesday, February 7th meeting at 2:30 at 333 W National Ave, Brillion—more help is welcome!

Speaking of volunteers—<u>thank you</u> to all who have supported this mission in some way—donations, time volunteering on projects, and prayers! The Lord has blessed this endeavor greatly as things continue to come together.

We have gone through some items that were already at church and that were accumulated when we went to purchase items at places that were closing down—(these places had a "you have to take everything") even if you just wanted certain items—the deals were great on what we wanted so we took everything! The items we can not use at the daycare center for one reason or another (licensing is pretty picky or we already have more than we need)—are in the fellowship hall along the back wall. Please take what you can use and if you like—you can put a donation for the item(s) in the envelope on the bench chair. There are booster seats (I did take the covers home and wash/sanitize them) and a couple of "pack and plays" - I do not know what shape they are in so you might want to take a look before you take them home. Lots of miscellaneous!
